COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Cutting Edge 2016 Aesthetic Surgery Symposium is an advanced comprehensive course covering all aspects of rhinoplasty.

A world-renowned faculty of plastic surgeons and facial plastic surgeons, with vast rhinoplasty experience, will present advanced nasal sculpting with open and closed rhinoplasty techniques. Subjects that will be covered in detail include nasal aesthetic balance, sculpting and controlling tip shape, increasing and decreasing projection, shortening and lengthening, correction of alar and columella deformities, dorsal reduction and augmentation, nasal function, correcting the crooked nose, secondary and tertiary rhinoplasty, and variations in rhinoplasty for ethnic and anatomic differences. Fillers and fat are increasingly being used to change nasal appearance. This is a need to know area for all surgeons performing rhinoplasty.
